WHAT IS HUS? (D+ OR TYPICAL)

HUS D+, o Hemolytic Uremic Sindrome D+ is a disease that attacks mainly children less than 5 years old and starts with a mild watery diarrhea that progresses to bloody in most cases. Children can also have paleness, irritability, vomits, convulsions and urinate less.

In our country it is an endemic disease transmitted mainly by food contaminated with a bacteria named Enterohemorrhagic Escherichia coli. It is present during the whole year, specially in summer.

This disease is the first cause of acute renal failure in children younger than 5 years of age. It can cause death or leave life-lasting sequelae like chronic renal insufficiency, high blood pressure and neurological alterations.

In Argentina lies the highest incidence of HUS in the world, an approximate of 400 new cases per year. Mortality in the acute stage is 2 to 4%. Since year 2000 (Res. 346/00) its report is mandatory.

WHO ARE WE?

SOURCES OF INFECTION

Undercooked meat.

- Meat juice.
- Unpasteurized processed milk and/or fruit juices.
- Contaminated water (from pools and rivers).
- Direct contact with field animals.
- Poorly cleaned hands, kitchen tools and/or surfaces.

HOW TO PREVENT HUS



Wash your hands with soap and water before eating or processing foods, touching raw meat or going to the bathroom. Teach your children to always do the same too.



Wash carefully fruits and vegetables.



Watch for the thorough cooking of hamburgers, since they are the main cause of contamination in children.



Water intended for drinking and/or used for cooking must be potabilized. If you are not sure whether it is or not, add 2 drops of leach or boil it for 5 minutes.



Cook meat well -specially chopped meat-, until it loses its pink colour.



Always consume pasteurized milk products and fruit juices. Keep them in the refrigerator.



Do not use the same kitchen tools or surfaces where you processed meat for other foods (fruits and/or vegetables) without cleaning them with water and detergent first.



Keep both fresh and cooked meals in the refrigerator.



Avoid contact of raw meat with any other kind of food.



Don't let children bath in contaminated waters. Check for adequate chlorination of the pools they attend.
